Course Description

“Student dancers develop basic skills in performing and evaluating choreographed performances as an independent ensemble and in cooperation with a music ensemble. Emphasis is placed on dance, equipment manipulation, precision, and the relationship between music and dance. Public performances may serve as a culmination of specific instructional goals. Students may be required to attend and/or participate in rehearsals and performances outside the school day to support, extend, and assess learning in the classroom.”

Course Requirements

Marching Band

During the fall semester, participation in the marching band is required. Please refer to the full Band Handbook (available at www.UHSband.com) for details.

Winter Guard

Membership in the Winter Guard is strongly encouraged (but not required). Auditions and rehearsals begin in December and continue through the FFCC Championships at the end of March.

FBA Auxiliary Solo & Ensemble

Students will choreograph and perform a solo or ensemble routine and perform at the Florida Bandmasters' Association Auxiliary Solo & Ensemble event. This takes place on a Friday or Saturday at the beginning of February. The exact schedule is not released until shortly before the event, so please keep both days clear.

Spring Guard Recital

Students will choreograph and perform a solo or chamber (2 – 4 person) routine and perform at the Spring Guard Recital in May. All members of the class will also perform as a full ensemble.

Participation

Students are required to actively participate in each class. If this is not possible due to medical reasons, a doctor's note is required.

Dress Out

Students are required to participate in class using comfortable, dance-appropriate attire. (Jeans are not considered dance-appropriate attire.) Time is given to change at the beginning and end of class.

Classwork

Additional work may be assigned periodically at the instructor's discretion.

Leadership

Guard Captains and any other designated student leaders may be given additional assignments.
