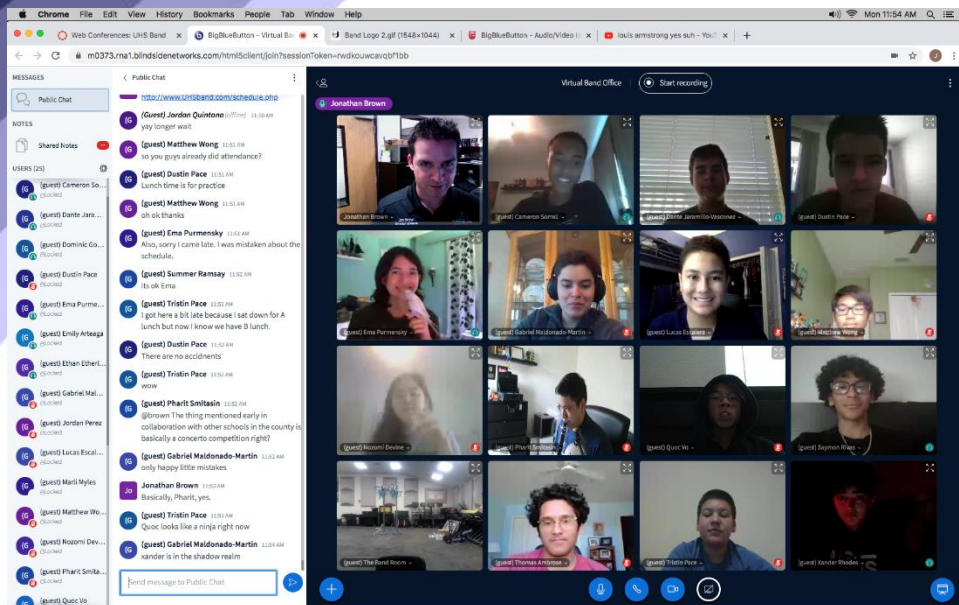

## INSTRUMENT PICKUP

The UHS Band Room will be open on **Monday, August 17** and **Tuesday, August 18** from **2:30 PM – 5:00 PM** for instrument pickup. Please note the following:

- The cost of renting an instrument from the school is \$40/semester. This money helps to cover instrument acquisition, maintenance, and repair. The instrument rental cost is assessed *in addition to* the Deposit and Spring Assessment.
- Students who are picking up an instrument should enter the band room through the back door (by the practice field) and exit through the front door.
- Face coverings are required.
- You must email Mr. Brown **before 12 o'clock noon on the day of pickup** with the instrument you'd like to check out so that we can make sure one is available.
- Multiple students may not share the same instrument.
- If you check out an instrument, you are responsible for it.
- Some additional paperwork may be required in order to bring an instrument home.

Finally, it's important to make sure you are establishing a practice routine that actually involves picking up your instrument and playing it once in a while! We recommend a minimum of 30 – 45 minutes a day, and more if possible. Parents, please support your children in finding the best time and place to do this. It is our intention to come back together – whenever that may be – stronger than we left!
