Someone's Song

This bolero was originally composed in the mid 1990s as a simple lead sheet for my jazz combo to perform. Since then it has undergone several transformations. The first complete arrangement was the brass quintet version which is also available on this website as part of the "21 Brass Quintets" package. The brass quintet version was recorded by the Texas Brass Ensemble on their CD titled "The Sounds of the South".

This big band version of "Someone's Song" is actually an extension of the brass quintet version. The first half of the arrangement comes directly from that first version of the piece. Then I added a solo section with some nice accompanimental figures and finished it off with the full ensemble.

Performance Notes:

The solo part is in the fourth trumpet. The "cue" notes are the actual solo part and the full sized notes are ensemble parts. If there is a separate fourth trumpet player besides the soloist, that player may play all of the full sized notes while the soloist plays everything else.

The tempo is quarter note at 104.

What is a bolero????

Do NOT confuse the bolero style with Ravel's famous work for orchestra by that name. It's not that. My description isn't exactly correct, but I often describe the bolero to younger players as being something similar to a slow rumba. The best thing for the drummers to do is to listen to some classic boleros to learn this style. Look for songs like, "Sabora Mi", "Usted" and "Solamente Una Vez"

What is Guajira?

Towards the end of the second part of the form, this tune has four bars of Guajira. Probably the most popular guajira today is a Carlos Santana song called "Oye Como Va". Another popular guajira is called "Guantanamera".
